



Q: What is the Family Law Information Program?

A: The Family Law Information Program is an online resource, developed by Legal Aid Ontario, for families and former spouses and partners about to enter the family justice system. The content of the program is based on the Mandatory Information Programs which are being rolled out across the province by the Ministry of the Attorney General.

The program provides information on legal and practical issues related to child custody, support payments, property settlements, and shared parenting. It also explains legal definitions, and delivers information on legal representation, dispute resolution, and the family court process in general.

Q: Who is this program for?

A: This information will be useful to legal aid clients, and anyone who needs information about the family justice system in Ontario.

Q: How long does it take to go through all of the materials?

A: It takes about two hours to complete the program. However, the flexible online format means that users can view the program whenever it's convenient for them.

Q: Where can the program be used?

A: The program can be used from any computer that has internet access.

Q: Is this part of the Ministry of the Attorney General's Mandatory Information Program?

A: No. However, the content of the program is based on the content of the Mandatory Information Program. Essentially the program provides the same information in a web-format that can be viewed repeatedly at a pace which is comfortable to the viewer.
